## **APPROVAL CRITERIA**

Requests for glatiramer acetate (Copaxone, Glatopa) may be approved if the following criteria are met:

 Individual has a diagnosis of relapsing multiple sclerosis (RMS) (including clinically isolated syndrome, relapsing-remitting disease or active secondary progressive disease).

Requests for **brand** Copaxone must also meet the following criterion, in addition to the above Prior Authorization criteria:

 Individual has had a trial (medication samples/coupons/discount cards are excluded from consideration as a trial) and was unable to tolerate glatiramer acetate (generic Copaxone).

Glatiramer acetate (Copaxone, Glatopa) may **not** be approved for the following:

- I. Individual is using to treat primary progressive multiple sclerosis (PPMS); **OR**
- II. Individual is using to treat non-active secondary progressive multiple sclerosis (SPMS); **OR**
- III. Use in combination with other multiple sclerosis disease modifying agents (including Aubagio, Avonex, Bafiertam, Betaseron, Extavia, Gilenya, Kesimpta, Lemtrada, Mavenclad, Mayzent, Ocrevus, Plegridy, Ponvory, Rebif, Tecfidera, Tysabri, Vumerity and Zeposia; **OR**
- IV. May not be approved when the above criteria are not met and for all other indications.
