When this drug list (formulary) refers to “we,” “us,” or “our,” it means Pharmacy Benefit Dimensions, an Independent Health company. When it refers to “plan” or “our plan,” it means Independent Health's Medicare Retiree Rx (PDP) provided by Labor-Management Healthcare Fund.

Independent Health's Medicare Retiree Rx is a PDP plan with a Medicare contract. Enrollment in Independent Health's Medicare Retiree Rx depends on contract renewal.

This document includes a list of the drugs (formulary) which is current as of 11/01/2015. For an updated formulary, please contact us. Our contact information, along with the date we last updated the formulary, appears on the front and back cover pages.

You must generally use network pharmacies to use your prescription drug benefit. Benefits, formulary, pharmacy network, and/or copayments/coinsurance may change on January 1 of each year, and from time to time during the year.

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What is the Independent Health's Medicare Retiree Rx (PDP) provided by Labor-Management Healthcare Fund Formulary?

The formulary below is a list of covered drugs which represents the prescription therapies believed to be a necessary part of a quality treatment program. This formulary includes drugs traditionally covered by Medicare, as well as additional drugs covered by Labor-Management Healthcare Fund under your plan. Drugs listed in our formulary will generally be covered as long as the drug is medically necessary, the prescription is filled at a Pharmacy Benefit Dimensions network pharmacy, and other plan rules are followed. For more information on how to fill your prescriptions, please review your Evidence of Coverage.

Can the Formulary (drug list) change?

Generally, if you are taking a drug on the 2015 formulary that was covered at the beginning of the year, the drug will not be discontinued, nor will coverage be reduced during the 2015 coverage year except when a new, less expensive generic drug becomes available or when new adverse information about the safety or effectiveness of a drug is released. Other types of formulary changes, such as removing a drug from the formulary, will not affect members who are currently taking the drug. It will remain available at the same cost-sharing for those members taking it for the remainder of the coverage year. We feel it is important that you have continued access for the remainder of the coverage year to the formulary drugs that were available when you were enrolled in our plan, except for cases in which you can save additional money or we can ensure your safety.

If Labor-Management Healthcare Fund approves changes to the formulary, including removing drugs, adding prior authorization, implementing quantity limits and/or step therapy restrictions on a drug, or moving a drug to a higher cost-sharing tier, Pharmacy Benefit Dimensions must notify affected members of the change at least 60 days before the change becomes effective, or at the time the member requests a refill of the drug, at which time the member will receive a 60-day supply of the drug. If the Food and Drug Administration deems a drug on our formulary to be unsafe or the drug's manufacturer removes the drug from the market, that medication will immediately be removed from our formulary and notice will be provided to members who take the drug. The enclosed formulary is current as of 11/01/2015. To get updated information about the drugs covered by Independent Health's Medicare Retiree Rx (PDP) provided by Labor-Management Healthcare Fund, please contact Member Services. Contact information appears on the front and back cover pages. In the event that a non-maintenance change to the formulary occurs prior to the monthly publication update, such change will be communicated via an ERRATA sheet, which will be available on our website and in printed form.

How do I use the Formulary?

There are two ways to find your drug within the formulary:

Medical Condition

The formulary begins on page 3. The drugs in this formulary are grouped into categories depending on the type of medical conditions that they are used to treat. For example, drugs used to treat a heart condition are listed under the category, Cardiovascular Agents. If you know what your drug is used for, look for the category name in the list that begins on page number 1. Then look under the category name for your drug.

Alphabetical Listing

If you are not sure what category to look under, you should look for your drug in the Index that begins on page 103. The Index provides an alphabetical list of all of the drugs included in this document. Both brand name drugs and generic drugs are listed in the Index. Look in the Index and find your drug. Next to your drug, you will see the page number where you can find coverage information. Turn to the page listed in the Index and find the name of your drug in the first column of the list.

What are generic drugs?

This formulary includes both brand name drugs and generic drugs. A generic drug is approved by the FDA as having the same active ingredient as the brand name drug. Generally, generic drugs cost less than brand name drugs.

Are there any restrictions on my coverage?

Some covered drugs may have additional requirements or limits on coverage. These requirements and limits may include:

- **Prior Authorization:** Certain medications require prior authorization. Your physician will need to complete a prior authorization request form and return it to Pharmacy Benefit Dimensions for approval before you fill your prescriptions. If you don't get approval, the drug may not be covered.
- **Quantity Limits:** For certain drugs, we limit the amount of the drug that we will cover. For example, we provide 12 tablets per prescription for ZOMIG. This may be in addition to a standard one-month or three-month supply.
- **Step Therapy:** In some cases, we require you to first try certain drugs to treat your medical condition before we will cover another drug for that condition. For example, if Drug A and Drug B both treat your medical condition, we may not cover Drug B unless you try Drug A first. If Drug A does not work for you, we will then cover Drug B.

You can find out if your drug has any additional requirements or limits by looking in the formulary that begins on page 3. You can also get more information about the restrictions applied to specific covered drugs by visiting our Web site. We have posted on line documents that explain our prior authorization restrictions and step therapy restrictions. You may also ask us to send you a copy. Our contact information, along with the date we last updated the formulary, appears on the front and back cover pages.

You can ask us to make an exception to these restrictions or limits or for a list of other, similar drugs that may treat your health condition. See the section, "How do I request an exception to the Independent Health's Medicare Retiree Rx (PDP) provided by Labor-Management Healthcare Fund formulary?" on the next page for information about how to request an exception.

What are over-the counter (OTC) drugs?

OTC drugs are non-prescription drugs that are not normally covered by a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan. Independent Health's Medicare Retiree Rx (PDP) provided by Labor-Management Healthcare Fund pays for certain OTC drugs. They include: ALAWAY; ALLEGRA-D; *benzoyl peroxide cr,gel,lot*; *cetirizine*; *cetirizine/pseudoephedrine*; CHERATUSSIN AC; CHERATUSSIN DAC; CLARITIN-D; *clotrimazole cream, lotion*,

soln; clotrimazole vaginal cream; FERREX FORTE; fexofenadine; fexofenadine/pseudoephedrine; IOPHEN C-NR; loratadine; miconazole cream, lotion, aerosol, soln; miconazole vaginal cream; NICODERM CQ; NICORETTE; nicotine patches, gum, lozenges; phenazopyridine; prenatal vitamins; PRILOSEC OTC; urea cream/lotion; VIRTUSSIN A/C; ZADITOR, and ZYRTEC. Over the Counter (OTC) drugs listed on the formulary must have a prescription (written or verbal) from a participating prescriber. Only those OTC drugs listed above are covered.

What if my drug is not on the Formulary?

If your drug is not included in this formulary (list of covered drugs), you should first contact Independent Health Member Services and ask if your drug is covered.

If you learn that we do not cover your drug, you have two options:

- You can ask Independent Health Member Services for a list of similar drugs that are covered by us. When you receive the list, show it to your doctor and ask him or her to prescribe a similar drug that is covered by us.
- You can ask us to make an exception and cover your drug. See below for information about how to request an exception.

How do I request an exception to the Independent Health's Medicare Retiree Rx (PDP) provided by Labor-Management Healthcare Fund Formulary?

You can ask us to make an exception to our coverage rules. There are several types of exceptions that you can ask us to make.

- You can ask us to cover a drug even if it is not on our formulary. If approved, this drug will be covered at a pre-determined cost-sharing level, and you would not be able to ask us to provide the drug at a lower cost-sharing level.
- You can ask us to cover a formulary drug at a lower cost-sharing level. If approved this would lower the amount you must pay for your drug.
- You can ask us to waive coverage restrictions or limits on your drug. For example, for certain drugs, we limit the amount of the drug that we will cover. If your drug has a quantity limit, you can ask us to waive the limit and cover a greater amount.

Generally, we will only approve your request for an exception if the alternative drugs included on the plan's formulary, [the lower cost-sharing drug] or additional utilization restrictions would not be as effective in treating your condition and/or would cause you to have adverse medical effects.

You should contact us to ask us for an initial coverage decision for a formulary, tiering or utilization restriction exception. **When you request a formulary, tiering or utilization restriction exception you should submit a statement from your prescriber or physician supporting your request.** Generally, we must make our decision within 72 hours of getting your prescriber's supporting statement. You can request an expedited (fast) exception if you or your doctor believe that your health could be seriously

harmed by waiting up to 72 hours for a decision. If your request to expedite is granted, we must give you a decision no later than 24 hours after we get a supporting statement from your doctor or other prescriber.

What do I do before I can talk to my doctor about changing my drugs or requesting an exception?

As a member in this plan, you may be taking drugs that are not on this formulary. Or, you may be taking a drug that is on the formulary but your ability to get it is limited. For example, you may need a prior authorization form completed and approved before you can fill your prescription. You should talk to your doctor to decide if you should switch to an appropriate drug or request a formulary exception. While you talk to your doctor to determine the right course of action for you, your drug may be covered in certain cases during the first 90 days you are a member of our plan.

For each of your drugs that is not on our formulary or if your ability to get your drugs is limited, a temporary 30-day supply will be covered (unless you have a prescription written for fewer days) when you go to a network pharmacy. After your first 30-day supply, these drugs will not be paid for, even if you have been a member of the plan less than 90 days.

If you are a resident of a long-term care facility, we will allow you to refill your prescription until we have provided you with 91-98 day transition supply, consistent with dispensing increment, (unless you have a prescription written for fewer days). We will cover more than one refill of these drugs for the first 90 days you are a member of our plan. If you need a drug that is not listed in this formulary, or if your ability to get your drugs is limited, but you are past the first 90 days of membership in our plan, a 31-day emergency supply of that drug will be covered (unless you have a prescription for fewer days) while you pursue a formulary exception.

For enrollees admitted or discharged from a long-term care facility or have had any change in level of care, early refill edits will not be used to limit appropriate and necessary access to your benefit and you are allowed to access a refill upon admission or discharge without restrictions. LTC pharmacies are permitted to use Emergency Boxes (E Box) when necessary. However the E Box should be replenished from the patient's monthly prescription claim.

If you are a new or current Medicare Part D enrollee transitioning from one treatment setting to another or experience transitions due to level of care changes, Independent Health will provide a supply of medication pursuant to CMS requirements in compliance with transition and continuity of care provisions as follows:

- At a retail pharmacy a one-time 30-day transition supply (unless the prescription is written for less than 30 days) will be authorized with refills to total 30 days of medication.
- If you are a resident of a long-term care facility, a 91- 98 day supply (unless the prescription is written for less) will be authorized with refills if needed.

After authorizing the temporary fills referred to above, we will send you a letter via the U.S. mail within three (3) business days, detailing the temporary nature of the transition supply you have received, instructions for working with the plan and your doctor to identify appropriate therapeutic alternatives that are in the Independent Health's Medicare Retiree Rx (PDP) provided by Labor-Management Healthcare

Fund formulary, an explanation of your right to request a formulary exception and a description of the procedures for requesting a formulary exception. We will also send a copy of the letter to your doctor.

Independent Health's Medicare Retiree Rx (PDP) provided by Labor-Management Healthcare Fund Formulary

The formulary that begins on page 3 provides coverage information about the drugs covered by Independent Health's Medicare Retiree Rx (PDP) provided by Labor-Management Healthcare Fund. If you have trouble finding your drug in the list, turn to the Index that begins on page 103.

The first column of the chart lists the drug name. Brand name drugs are capitalized (e.g., ZOMIG) and generic drugs are listed in lower-case italics (e.g., *penicillin*).

The information in the Requirements/Limits column tells you if we have any special requirements for coverage of your drug.

INFORMATION FOR MEMBERS WITH DIABETES

Insulin, syringes and pen needles are covered by your pharmacy benefit and are included in this formulary.

Diabetic testing supplies, including blood glucose meters, pumps, lancing devices, lancets and test strips are not listed on this formulary. These items are covered under Medicare Part B (your medical plan.) Your co-pay for these items is \$10 or 20% of the cost (whichever is lower.) Preferred products include ACCU-CHEK and OneTouch.

Please show your Independent Health Medicare Advantage medical card at the pharmacy when obtaining diabetic supplies.

VACCINES

Covered vaccinations will be available to you with a \$0 copay. Please show your Independent Health medical and pharmacy card to your provider when you are receiving a vaccine.

SYMBOLS

Drugs listed with a “*” in the Requirements/Limits column are not normally covered in a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan. The amount you pay when you fill a prescription for this drug does not count towards your total drug costs (that is, the amount that you pay does not help you qualify for catastrophic coverage). In addition, if you are receiving extra help to pay for your prescriptions, you will not get any extra help to pay for this drug.

Drugs listed with an “AL” in the Requirements/Limits column have age limitations.

Drugs listed with a “BD” in the Requirements/Limits column may be covered under Medicare Part B (your Medical Plan) or Part D (Your Rx Plan) depending upon the circumstances. Information may need to be submitted describing the use and setting of the drug to make the determination. If it is determined that coverage for this drug falls under Medicare Part B, your cost will not be the tier co-pay in this drug list. Please refer to Chapter 4 of your Evidence of Coverage for the cost of Part B drugs or contact **Independent Health’s Medicare Member Services Department**. Our contact information appears on the front and back cover pages.

Drugs listed with a “MO” in the Requirements/Limits column may be prescribed and dispensed at a participating network retail or mail order pharmacy for a 90-day supply. Your plan also includes use of the Option 90 Program: This program allows you to obtain up to a 90-day supply of maintenance medications at your local retail pharmacy or at one of our mail order vendors, ProAct Pharmacy Services or Wegmans Mail Order Pharmacy Services. Option 90 retail pharmacies and mail order vendors offer reduced copayments for your 90-day supply.

Drugs listed with a “PA” in the Requirements/Limits column require prior authorization (see “Are there any restrictions on my coverage” on page 3).

Drugs listed with a “QL” in the Requirements/Limits column have quantity limitations (see “Are there any restrictions on my coverage” on page 3).

Drugs listed with a “RF” in the Requirements/Limits column are restricted to females only.

Drugs listed with a “RM” in the Requirements/Limits column are restricted to males only.

Drugs listed with a “SP” in the Requirements/Limits column have limited distribution and are available from a specialty pharmacy.

Drugs listed with a “ST” in the Requirements/Limits column are restricted to step therapy requirements (see “Are there any restrictions on my coverage” on page 3).
